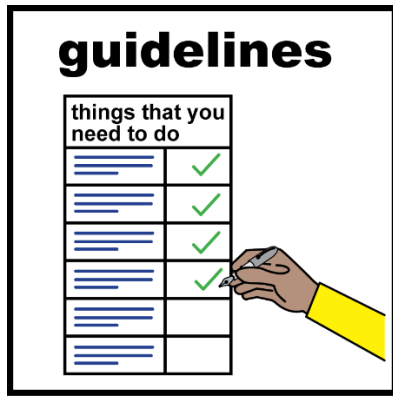




Guidelines for the Human Rights

treat people.



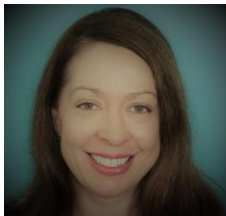
Advisory means you say what

A committee is a group of people that meet and work together.

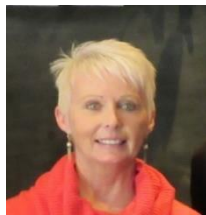


It is for Aruma people.

- Judy Topper to make sure the committee works well



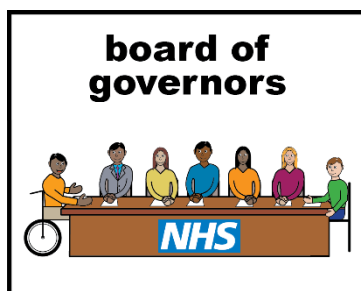
- Elyce Shearer to help



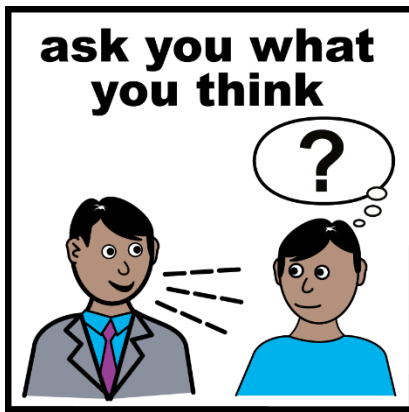

The board members will

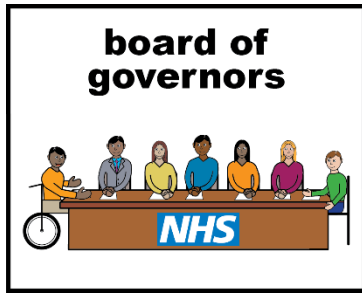
- tell us things happening at Aruma
- ask for your advice



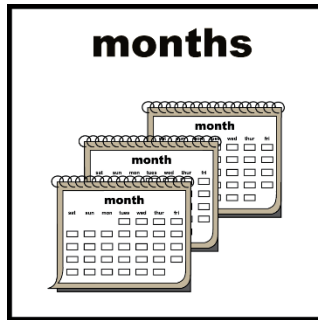
Some people who might come in are

The committee will meet every three months.

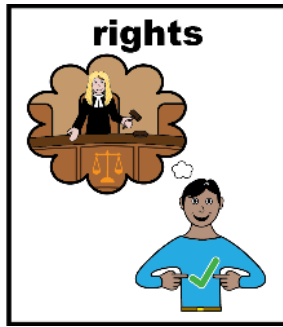


At the meeting we can talk about what is needed

- ideas you and others have about what we talk about



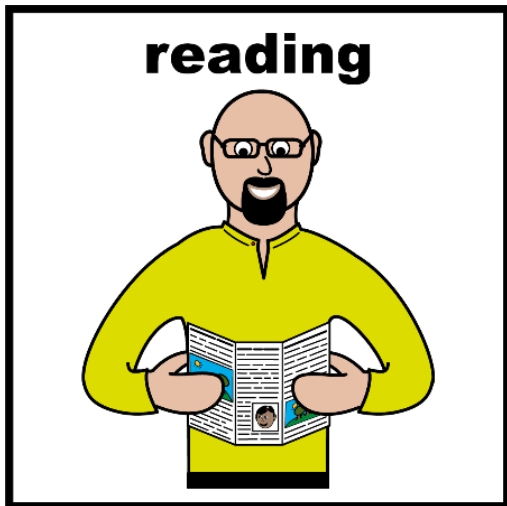
Think about Aruma strategic plan

and give better service

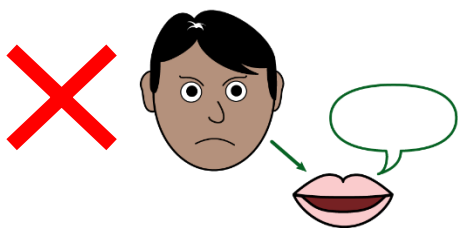


For the committee to work well

- agree to the guidelines

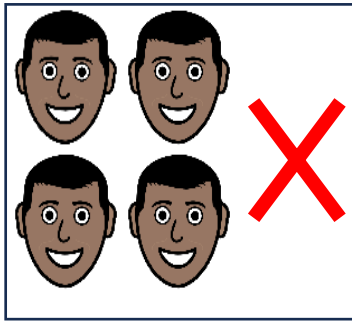


We do not want you to use the meeting to talk about your personal problems.



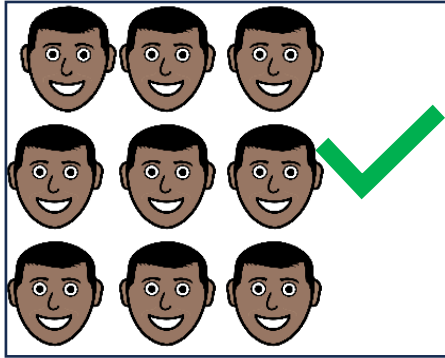
We can help you after the meeting to find the best way to

- give feedback

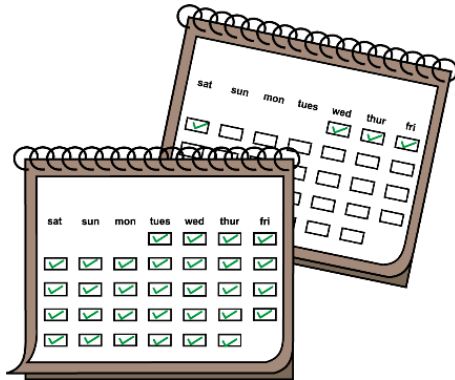


We will cancel the meeting if

- 1 person to make sure the meeting runs well



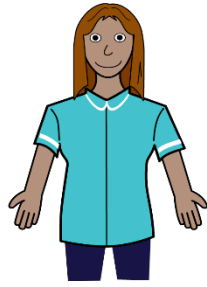
- 8 people



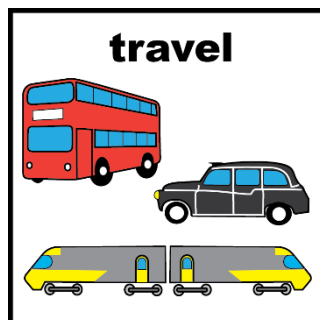
- We will invite you to every meeting for two years.

on.



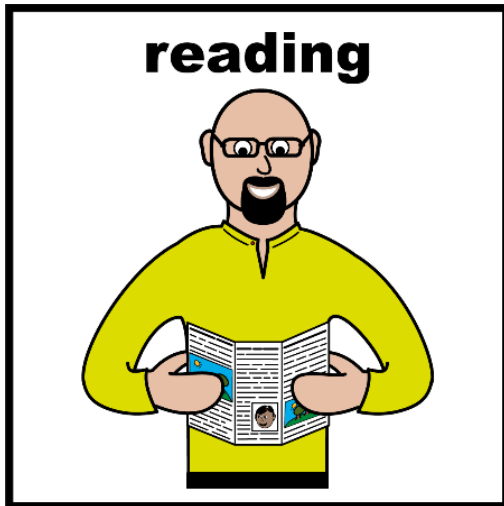
Aruma staff will be paid to go to

You need to ask.



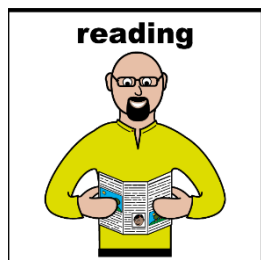

You can learn by

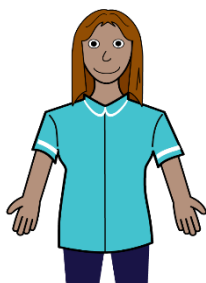
